1. Educational Goals for the Course:

- Educators will acquire knowledge of using the TRIBES human development process to implement cooperative learning within their classrooms.

2. Instructional Learning Objectives – *Educators will:*

(What will participants learn and put into practice as a result of completing this process?)

- Gain knowledge on the growth and development of 10-15 years old students and understand the impact of the TRIBES pattern of interaction over the traditional approaches for working with these students.
- Determine how this class will help them improve on the Idaho Teaching Framework evaluation and which specific components of this Framework are addressed in this class.
- Concentrate on Charlotte Danielson's Teaching Framework Domain 2, The Classroom Environment, where they will focus on teacher and student interaction with respect and rapport.
- Concentrate on the Teaching Framework Domain 3 where their focus will be how to engage students in learning.

3. Course Requirements – *Educators will:*

In Class:

- Attend and participate in all sessions.

Out of Class:

- Develop a two week plan of TRIBES learning experiences to be used in his/her individual classroom.
- Write a daily reflection of their individual Tribes learning experience, including what went right, what areas need improvement, and what they plan for their 'next steps.'
- Read the assigned material from the TRIBES manual and complete these assignments including a multiple intelligences assessment--to be brought to class for peer review.
- After each reading class assignments, educators will journal how they will use an example from the reading in their classrooms.
